This by-election is taking place because former district councillor Stuart Curtis resigned owing to his ill health. His recent and untimely death is a cause of great sadness for many.

Mr. Ashley Perraton-Williams, Chairman of the Conservative Association, said:

"It is with great sadness that I learnt of the death of a stalwart friend of the Association. Stuart Curtis had been a dedicated local councillor at West Lindsey District Council. I did not know Stuart as well as I might have wished, however, I know that he will be greatly missed by all those who knew him."

Stuart lived in Sudbrooke all

his life. On leaving school he was employed by Lincoln solicitors Burton & Co., and remained with them for over fifty years until his retirement. Stuart qualified as a Fellow of the Institute of Legal Executives specialising in residential and commercial conveyancing and was made Chairman of the Lincolnshire and South Humberside branch of the institute.

Stuart served as a district councillor for eighteen years, as a member of Sudbrooke Parish Council and was a founder member of the Sudbrooke Village Hall Committee.

Local councils get the money they spend from three main sources: fees paid for services, the council tax and grants from central government - and this has been cut massively and will soon be gone entirely.

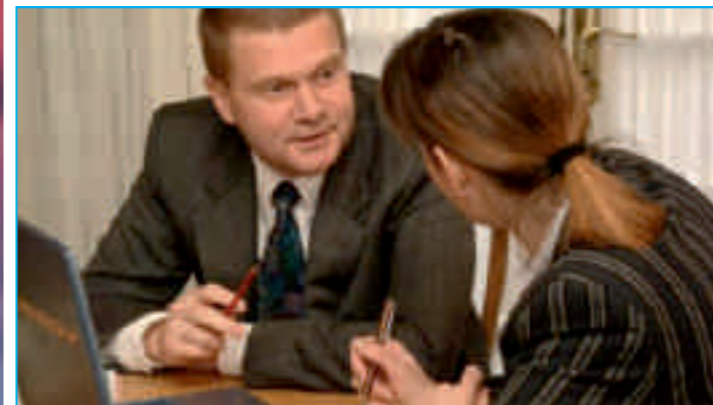
Conservatives have kept the council tax low as we promised. By embracing a commercial approach we can keep providing valued front-line services.
