The main concern in the Waddingham, and the Hemswell wards is the application for the huge wind turbine farm, and the possibility of others around Corringham. We will get no support from the Liberal party whose baby this is in parliament, and also at the district council. We Conservatives on our county council have called for a ban on anymore wind farms in Lincolnshire, unless there are exceptional circumstances, .I am working very hard to support the local residents who have filed 2,500 letters of objection. As a West Lindsey councillor I am working with other councillors, the excellent VOCAT – (Villages Of the Cliff Against Turbines), and of course Edward Leigh MP against this development which the residents simply do not want. Ten years ago we all fought hard to prevent an immigration centre being built at Hemswell cliff and we won. **WE CAN DO IT AGAIN.**

Of course this has no bearing on rural businesses, who wish to develop their own forms of energy saving-solar, heat pumps, digesters or a turbine if for a specific farm use.

We have delivered the Rasens recycling centre as we promised, which ties in neatly with the Energy from waste plant at Hykeham that has been my particular responsibility for the last six years, which opens in July - ending the curse of landfill, and supplying energy.

High speed broadband is on its way, and BT says ours will be among the best in Europe! The difficult-to-reach areas are being addressed, and shortly local IT companies will be able to provide acceptable service whilst village halls, with poor reception, will receive the high speed connection, within a very short time.
